The Processes & Procedures Ordinance will make it easier to understand how City Planning considers use and development proposals, overhaul the text of the LA Municipal Code (LAMC) The city expects to implement Project Objectives (state mandated elements below)

Housing Element Rezoning Program FD_HE Rezoning Law Fact Sheet 110124

The Rezoning Program must be adopted and effectuated by February 12, 2025 (three years and 120 days from the original 2021-2029 Housing Element adoption deadline). Failure to adopt a rezoning program that accommodates the City's RHNA target by the February 2025 deadline may require the City to issue by-right approvals. LA's requirement 486,379 units. Land Use Element is one of **seven State-Mandated** elements of the General Plan that include noise, housing, open space, mobility, safety and conservation (CA Code 65302)

Community Plans Canoga Park-Winnetka-Woodland Hills-West Hills Community Plan; Encino-Tarzana Community Plan; and Reseda-West Van Nuys Southwest Valley <u>https://planning.lacity.gov/eir/nops/swv_cp/nop.pdf</u> Proposed Boundary change #4 Van Nuys Airport is primarily within the Reseda-West Van Nuys plan, however, the VNY MASTER Plan extends outside the boundaries and into Mission Hills-Panorama City-North Hills Community Plan. <u>nop.pdf</u>

Metro Joint Development (JD) Program

Metro collaborates with developers to build transit-oriented developments on Metro-owned properties. Metro aims to build as much quality housing on these sites as possible-as quickly as possible-for those who need it most.

Metro is undertaking an ambitious plan to increase the supply of high quality housing, especially income-restricted affordable units, on underutilized Metro properties.
